All students are asked to be present at the fall registration session on **August 21**. This year's registration is being held in the Cafeteria (Room 124) at Central High School. **All students should attend registration anytime between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. this day, regardless of grade.**

IN ADDITION:

- **9th Grade Orientation** is August 22 from 8 a.m. – 12 p.m. and starts in the Auditorium.
- **Transfer Student Orientation** is August 22 at 1 p.m. in the Student Services Office.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

All stations located in Cafeteria

- SIGN IN** • Return **signed** District Code of Rights & Responsibilities / Student Information Verification Sheet.

Students will not be allowed to complete the registration process without the form(s) signed by a parent/guardian and the student info update must be completed. **Do not mail these in! Your student must bring them when he/she comes to register.**
- PAY FEES**
 - \$20 Season Activity Pass (Optional) *The I.D. card will signify a pass has been purchased and will admit the student to all Central and Logan home athletic events.*
 - \$150 Family Pass (Optional) *with a list of immediate family members who need a pass.*
- LUNCH MONEY** • This needs to be paid on a separate check.
The kitchen will be open to accept any payment for student lunch accounts.
- PHOTOS** • All students, including seniors, need to have a picture taken by Lifetouch Photography. These pictures will be used for your Central I.D.
 - Underclassmen may also purchase photo packages at this time. Information regarding photo packages is included in this packet.
 - **Underclassmen:** If you do not have your picture taken at registration or later make-up dates, you will not appear in the yearbook.
- LAPTOP INSURANCE FORM and PAYMENT (if not yet completed)**
- MEDICATIONS (if needed)** • Turn in any prescription medications along with the signed doctor's order.
- OBTAIN FINAL SCHEDULE** • Verify your locker assignment and combination.



Family Information Update

For returning students to School District of La Crosse

Again this summer, La Crosse Schools provides the option for returning La Crosse School District families to update their student information through Online Family Access. By updating this information online, the enrollment forms that we use in the fall should be up to date. **Family Information Update opened July 1st. Please make sure your information is updated prior to Registration Day on August 21st.** This “information update” tells the district your student is returning in the fall and it provides the district with the most up to date contact information.

To complete the update, go to **www.lacrosseschools.org** and click on Family/Student Access on the right side of the web page. If you do not know your Family Access login/password, you can click on the **Forgot your login or password** link and your login information will be emailed to you if we have a current email address in the system. You can also call your child’s school for your information. If your school is closed please call the Welcome Center at 789-7756 for your initial login information.

Once you log in, you’ll see the screen below. Click on the button for “Start Family Information Update for....” **You’ll need to complete this for each of your children.** Select each of your children’s names from the Student drop down menu at the top of the window. If the window below does not display, click on “School Year 2019-20” under Family Information Update on the left side of the screen.

Thanks for completing the Family Information Update, just a reminder; **you’ll still need to attend your school’s orientation and registration days.**



Address Updates and Verifications

If you have a change of address it is very important that you update your student records with us. District policy requires that all first family addresses be verified. This is a simple process that involves presenting one current document verifying residency and can be done either in the 2nd Floor Office at Central or in the Registrar’s Office at the Hogan Administrative Center. No changes will be made to student records without this verification.

Should you move outside the Central attendance area we will work with you to complete the appropriate paperwork necessary for your student to continue to attend Central, if possible. We must have a current address so that you receive many important communications including grades, attendance, discipline, and registration information. Please keep your student’s records up to date!!



HIGHLY QUALIFIED TEACHERS

The School District of La Crosse takes pride in hiring only highly qualified teachers. This means they all are fully trained, certified, and often experienced in the position they teach. Our faculty consistently has a high percentage of advanced degrees, and we do a good job of retaining some of the top staff in the state and the nation. Life events, such as retirement, childbirth, or illness, sometimes cause a need for a long-term substitute teacher. When this happens we always make every effort to hire a highly qualified substitute. All are certified teachers and most are licensed in the area in which they are substituting. In rare cases it may be impossible to find a teacher with a particular certification, such as special education. This may result in the district asking the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction for an emergency license for such a teacher. If you ever have any questions about the certification of any of our staff, please contact Troy McDonald, Principal of Central High School.

ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Central High School will again utilize our computerized calling system, Skylert for attendance purposes. Skylert is a device that plugs into our existing computer system. It has the capability of reading the absence report and can automatically call parents when their students are reported absent without reason.



A pre-recorded message will be received by parents the same evening informing them that their student was marked absent in one or more classes that day. The parent will then be instructed to call the Attendance Office the following school day.

It is the student's responsibility to resolve each absence. Failure to resolve an absence will result in truancy.

It is the parent's/guardian's responsibility to call the Attendance Office the day of an absence. **If our lines are busy or you call when the office is not open, please leave a message.**

1. **If your son or daughter will be missing the whole day, please call the Attendance Office no later than 12:00 p.m. the same day.**
2. **If your son or daughter will be leaving school for an appointment, please call the Attendance Office prior to the time the student will be leaving. It is the student's responsibility to obtain a dismissal pass from the Attendance Office to show the teacher for whose class he/she will be leaving. Again, if the student returns to school following the appointment, he/she must let the Attendance Office know upon arrival. If your student will not be returning to school after the appointment, the office must be notified the same day.**
3. **If your student will be missing two (2) or more days due to vacation, scheduled surgery, etc., please call the Attendance Office at least one (1) week before the absence. This type of absence must be approved by the student's administrator. A pre-excused form will then be issued and must be signed by all teachers. When this form is completed, it should be turned into the Attendance Office at which time the absence will be excused.**
4. **If your son or daughter becomes ill at school, he/she must sign out with our Health**

Assistant. Failure to do so may result in an unexcused absence. Parents will be notified and arrangements will be made at this time.

Again, we stress that it is the parent's or guardian's responsibility to notify the Attendance Office. Thank you for your cooperation.

WORK PERMITS

During the school year, work permits may be obtained from 7:00—2:00 PM from Mrs. Goodman in the 1st Floor Office. **Please plan accordingly.** **Students may drop off their paperwork in the morning and pick up their work permit at the end of the day. To obtain a work permit, you must present the following:**

1. Letter from the employer showing their address and phone number and advising the type of work the student will be doing.
2. A signature from a parent/guardian giving permission for the student to work.
3. **ORIGINAL** birth certificate (with embossed seal), baptismal certificate or driver's license
4. **ORIGINAL** Social Security card
5. \$10.00



HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION

The start of the school year is a great time to review the District's medication policy. On the health update sheet is an option to allow the Health Assistant to administer over the counter or prescriptions medications to your student during the school day.

To administer either over the counter medications, or prescriptions medications, a School Medication/Procedure Form needs to be filled out. For over the counter medications, just a parent/guardian signature is required.

For prescription medications, a **signature must be provided by the guardian and the physician.** All medications must be in the original labeled containers. Inhalers are the only medication that may be carried by students with permission of their doctor unless a special plan is set up by the school nurse and the principal. The form may be obtained from the Health Assistant, on the school website or at local clinics.



Don't hesitate to call the Health Assistant, Jessica Ahnen at 789-3012 if you have any questions or to discuss the health or medical condition of your student. The Health Assistant is at the school daily and a district nurse checks in regularly.

LATEX CONTROLLED SCHOOL

Central High School is a latex controlled school to meet the needs of students with latex allergies. Items that are not allowed at this school include latex gloves and latex balloons.

Any questions should be referred to an Administrator.



GOING HOME SICK?



If your child gets sick at school they **MUST** report to the Health Room located in the Attendance Office. Students should not text parents during class time, telling them they need to go home ill. If they are truly ill, they should be asking their teacher for permission to see the Health Assistant. The Health office is here for several reasons: First and foremost, to insure the safety of your child, secondly, to assist your child in determining if it is necessary for them to go home, and lastly to properly excuse them from school. For safety and security reasons, students should not leave school without checking out through the Health Room or one of our two offices.



SCHOOL ELEVATOR

Central High School offers students with a medical condition the use of the elevator during school hours. We do ask you to provide us with a doctor's note requesting this accommodation. Please encourage your child to use the elevator and NOT the stairs if he/she is using crutches. We will not tolerate students abusing the use of the elevator, as we also use it for medical emergencies. STUDENT SCHEDULES

When examining your child's schedule, check it over to be sure they have **at least SIX classes** each semester. Also, look for study halls to confirm that they are evenly distributed between each semester. If there is a problem with your child's schedule, have them see their counselor. **The ONLY reason a schedule will be changed is if there is an error, if there is an imbalance in classes each semester, or if a student has failed a class and will need to retake it.**

IMPORTANT TEST DATE FOR JUNIORS

The PSAT is the entry level qualifying exam for the National Merit Scholarship. The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) conducts academic competitions for recognition and college scholarships. High school students enter these programs, usually as juniors, by taking the PSAT and meeting other published entry requirements. NMSC considers the scores a student receives to determine if that student meets the requirements. For more information check out the NMSC's website at www.nationalmerit.org. The test will only be given on Wednesday, October 16th. There will be a \$17.00 fee. Registration will begin in September.

HOW TO SEE YOUR COUNSELOR

The Student Services Office is open from 7:35 AM -3:25 PM on days that school is in session. Students may see their counselors in the following ways:

1. By scheduling an appointment. Students can stop in and schedule an appointment during a time that is convenient for them. These appointments should be during a student's free period.
2. All counselors are available during Mastery Learning Time (MLT) on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Students will be seen on a first-come, first-serve basis.
3. By stopping in. Students are welcome to stop in between classes or during their free periods to see if their counselor is available at that time.

If a student is in crisis, they should inform the Student Services' Secretary so that they can be seen immediately.

COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS PARENT MEETING

The Senior Parent Night will be held on September 18th at 5:30 PM in Room 232. At this time, the counselors will explain the college application process and answer any questions that students and parents may have concerning post secondary plans. Seniors will also receive this information in their English classes the second week of school.

Information available in Student Services is an integral part of the School/Home partnership. Seniors are especially encouraged to come in *frequently* for post-secondary information. There are continual additions being made to our “scholarship opportunities” listing, as well.

Come in and use the resources that are available to both students and parents. If you have questions or concerns, call us. If you would like to meet during the day, call to make an appointment to come in. We want to help students and parents become well informed. Don't forget to check out our updated web site. It also is a great resource! Go to www.lacroschools.org.

In addition, we would like to remind students and parents of a resource available to all students – Career Cruising. Career Cruising is an internet-based tool that helps students plan for their future. It includes assessment, career exploration, education, and portfolio development. It can be accessed from any computer that has internet access. Just go to www.careercruising.com and enter Central's username, [chs1801](#) and password, [redraiders](#). If your student would like to set up a personalized portfolio, they will need to stop in Student Services to have this done. Career Cruising is a valuable resource for students and their parents.



STUDENT SERVICES NEWS

SENIOR YEAR COURSE LOADS

Universities are looking for students who are taking a challenging course load their senior year in high school. A student's Senior year courses are extremely important because they give the foundation that is necessary to prepare for the academic rigors of college. Many students entering college do so with four years of math, science, English and social studies along with two additional academic credits that they have earned in high school. One of the considerations universities base their admission decision on is the extent to which a student takes above and beyond the "minimal" high school course requirements. If you think that your Senior's course load could use a boost, contact their counselor.

ORDERING TRANSCRIPTS

Central High School is pleased to provide you and your student the ability to send your child's official transcript to specific colleges/universities and the military for educational purposes. Your student will be using Parchment, the online transcript request service the school district has contracted with, to make the electronic transfer to institutions of your and/or your child's choice. Institutions of higher learning strongly suggest that they receive electronic transcripts to process applications.

Parents of seniors who are under the age of 18 need to complete a release form to allow Parchment to send your child's transcript. The form must be completed before a transcript is requested. The form is available in Student Services and will be part of your electronic files to sign during registration. If a student is 18, then they can request a transcript without parent permission. Once the form is completed it will need to be returned to Student Services. This form is good for the entire year.

ACT/SAT TEST SCORES

Every year we get questions from students and parents regarding the ACT/SAT scores. Should a student take advantage of the opportunity after taking the test to have scores sent directly from ACT/SAT for free? Should a student not have any scores sent until they apply to college? Which scores do colleges look at in determining if they will accept a student; the first, second, most recent or highest score?

Often, when a student first registers for the ACT/SAT, they decide not to send test scores because they do not want to send a score that might be considered low. However, colleges recommend that students take advantage of that free opportunity. According to the UW-Madison Counselor Update, a newsletter from the office of admissions, the University does not average test scores or use the most recent; "we always use the highest scores from one test date, no matter how many times a student retakes the test." It is important that students have their ACT/SAT scores sent directly from the testing agency as soon as they are available.

In addition, students should not send rush reports to the colleges. It will cost an additional \$25 and the scores will be sent by regular mail, which takes much longer for the colleges to process. Colleges receive electronic files at least weekly, and often biweekly, which means that they receive these scores well before they would receive the rushed reports.




