

## “Earn & Learn”

A Youth Apprentice can *earn* a paycheck from an employer and credit from school while they *learn* outside the building!

### HOW IT WORKS:

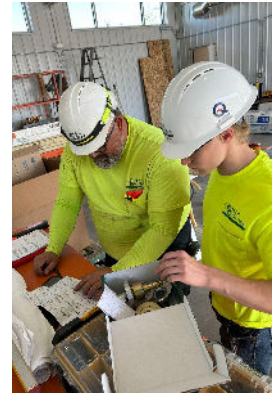
Students take 1 credit of Related Instruction at school while being an apprentice. An assigned mentor helps YAs on-the-job. Students *may* then bridge from a Youth Apprentice to Wisconsin’s Registered Apprenticeship program upon graduation.

### BENEFITS:

- Distinguished personal portfolio or resume experience
- Paid, on-the-job training while earning high school credit
- Certificate of occupational proficiency
- Develop a network of contacts in your career field
- Potential credit at a technical college or university

### REQUIREMENTS:

- Will be a junior or senior
- On-track for graduation
- A positive attendance record
- Reliable transportation to and from the workplace
- Participate in school-based YA meetings
- Work a minimum of 450 hours (may include non-school hours, weekends, & summertime)
- Take 1 credit of Related Instruction during work placement
- Be coachable and teachable during experience
