Do the Do tickets are part of our acknowledgement and reinforcement system at Northside Elementary.

Every student has the opportunity to earn a Do the Do ticket by following school rules.

One student from each grade is randomly chosen to become the Student of the Week.

Students of the Week earn:

- \* Name announced to entire school.
- \* Picture and ticket posted.
- \* Lunch or breakfast at the monthly Do the Do table.
- \* Name in school newsletter.
- \* Recognition at Success Assembly.

## WHAT IS A POSITIVE BEHAVIOR SUPPORT SYSTEM???

Positive Behavior Support systems, or PBS for short, promotes a school culture that encourages and reinforces positive behaviors while discouraging problem behaviors.

The PBS approach teaches students expectations and procedures and reminds them to use these positive, learned behaviors. We actively acknowledge students when they are responsible school citizens and teach them positive ways to correct behavior when they are not.

PBS promotes a safe environment where students achieve academically and build positive relationships with each other and with adults.

## BEHAVIOR COLOR CHART

Behavior color charts are a tool used by teachers at Northside Elementary to encourage positive behavior.

All students begin the day on Green and may be moved up or down on the chart depending on his or her behavior.

All students are responsible for their own choices and earn a position on the color chart as demonstrated by their ability to be safe, responsible, and respectful.

Colors below green have consequences that may vary slightly between classrooms but are all designed to assist children in making positive behavioral choices.

Students on Green or above are eligible to receive a Do the Do ticket. Children who end the day on red or who display unsafe behavior at school may receive an office referral/behavior report with an appropriate consequence and parents are notified.
