District Facility Updates	 Comments from Dr. Engel: Everyone should have received an email for a facilities survey as well as a physical survey doc in the mail Declining enrollment for a long time - declining birth rates all over, also impacting this area Revenue limit authorities are being impacted Many of the buildings are aging - particularly middle schools were build 90-100 years ago. Amenities and needs are different today. Some issues related to size of classroom, some related to ADA limitations Would take \$30 million to make proper updates - would just be buildings, not classroom needs We need to become more efficient - spend money on teachers and kids, not buildings Emerson and Spence are the oldest of the elementary schools. Options may include: Tear down both, build one new? Tear one down, expansion at the other? Middle schools - Lincoln continues to look like an opportunity to eliminate one school Montessori and SOTA II are both located in Lincoln and would be impacted High school - consider moving to single high school Opportunity to consolidate, but possibly maintain both schools (West Bend does this) We are the smallest district in WI with two high schools

 If we build new high school, could relocate current middle schools into existing high schools Would provide better opportunities for middle school students Referendums are required for these big changes Need to look at the needs of Charter (i.e. SOTA II needs an auditorium) May consider a secondary survey in the spring with more tax information Would look to go to referendum in November 2022 Current rates are lower, so a loan/refinance might be better, impacts to taxpayers may be lower as well

- Try near Lincoln next time (spring?)
- Provide music, yard games, and other activities to strengthen the community feel.
- 5. Restaurant Night:

We held a Burrachos night annually for a few years, at which we would be the designated charity and receive a portion of the proceeds from sales that night. We did not do this last year. Should we do this again this year? It is a relatively easy fundraiser: we just need to contact a restaurant to set something up, pick a date, and let people know. Do we as a group have interest in this, and if so who can take the lead on organizing?

Definitely mixed feelings about this from the group. Unless someone feels strongly and is willing to take the lead on this, I propose that we focus our collective efforts on the bigger events we have ahead of us.

6. Soup Supper:

Almost since the start of Coulee Montessori as a charter school, the school has held a Soup Supper fundraiser in February. This event served two purposes: it was a community gathering, and a silent auction served as a fundraiser for our school. We did not hold an event last year. What are the group's thoughts on holding this event this year? The gathering aspect of the event can be planned in January. If we are to hold a silent auction and rely on donations from local businesses, that outreach would need to start soon, and we would need someone willing to take the lead on organizing this work. (For those that are newer to the school: what questions do you have before you could weigh a decision on this?)

There is overall agreement that we should consider alternatives to a large raffle or silent auction. Amy proposed a run/walk event, and Kim has some perspective on having put an event like this on in the past. (And Melissa L. suggested we might consider a few raffle items anyway, but more as a an activity than as a fundraiser.)

7. Facility Planning:

Tonight Dr. Engel provided an overview of the facility questions facing the district, and has asked that we provide him with a vision of what our ideal Coulee Montessori would look like. We'll take this on in more depth in a separate discussion, but for now please think about this from your perspective, and jot down your thoughts. (To make this more concrete, you might also consider the positive and negative aspects of three different Coulee Montessori arrangements: (1) the current structure with CM holding 4k-5th and CMAP holding 6th-8th in separate facilities; (2) an alternative where CM holds 4k-6th and CMAP holds 7th-8th in separate facilities; (3) a combined CM that holds 4k-8th in a single facility.)

Hopefully everyone has had a chance to mull over the facility planning discussion with Dr. Engel from our last meeting. We'll be looking forward to seeing the feedback the district collected in their broad planning survey, and we should begin thinking about how to approach gathering input from the CM community. Who in the group has experience developing surveys, or knows someone that has done so? If needed we can probably lean on Hogan for some help, but this is big enough we definitely don't want to just piece this together.
