School Performance	Miss Nikki Ms. Bigelow	 E1 classrooms: CM staff looking for SET support of shifting back to 4 E1 classrooms as all 3 E1 classrooms are currently full With increased behavioral and academic needs, students and teachers would benefit from a 4th classroom Ideal 12-15 students, but currently 18-19 CM didn't need the additional support before, but changes in students have occurred (behavioral, socio economic) – more in alignment with Northside, however, current CM teacher/student ratio is higher than NS Would like to generate a report showing changes in economics, school changes CM was 25-35% free lunch, has increased to over 60% Consider parent volunteers as no new teachers would be added until next year Ms Pope to look at available school stats (Educlimber) Children's House update: Miss Nikki and Ms. Allison currently at 7PK, 10 K – extended invite to anyone on the wait list, no one has moved. Opportunity for additional support brought up during

Elementary Principal Report	Nicki Pope	 Enrollment update No change in move outs 5 adds, mostly in Children's House May need to consider some sort of exit survey for parents Referendum Per school district, if there was a time to build a new high school this is the time as other debt is being paid off and coming off taxes If referendum doesn't pass, anticipate shift to single high school due to ongoing enrollment decline (Shift all to Central High) May impact middle school as well (Shift middle school to Logan High) Cost estimates in the millions to fix existing buildings, but wouldn't provide any new learning spaces At Logan, you are not able to add a third story because of how the current structure is built Current referendum does not include an athletic structure If November referendum fails, there may be another one in April for operating costs

Looking at potential spaces for both SOTA II and CMAP Our document has been shared with those part of the planning While no formal announcement has been made yet, planning has started in preparation if Lincoln Middle closes next year Consider planning a separate meeting that could discuss combining CM and CMAP (K-8) into one location
Playground rubber chips	Jamie O'Niell	 Playground chips: Rubber chips have been determined unsafe/health hazard Several materials in the chips that have never been tested Can make breathing more difficult They heat up, test last year on a hot day reflected playground temp of 140 degrees UWL professor working on a testing process to understand hands that touch the rubber chips what toxins are detected SPACE looking for parents to join the informal community group and to assist in writing grants for schools interested Kim to discuss with Willie to see if he would be interested

		 Ms. Pope stated rubber chips has been on the building and grounds list for a while Options could be wood chips, pour in place or tiles Replacement is in the works, but is in the air when or what the material would be Buildings and grounds has final say on what/when replaced Ms. Pope reached out to the city to see if there would be any opportunity for helping with the expense since the playground is community used Swings: Delivery date pushed back to February 2023, will not disrupt the current rubber chips
