TO: All Academically Eligible 11th & 12th Grade Students
FROM: National Honor Society Faculty Committee

The Faculty Selection Committee of the National Honor Society (Hoongerah Chapter) will be reviewing all 11th and 12th grade students who are eligible for membership. Membership in the National Honor Society is considered an honor, but it is also an obligation to continue the very qualities that were required for admittance. Membership in the National Honor Society is based on excellence in four areas:

<u>SCHOLARSHIP:</u>	A 3.3 or better cumulative GPA, a credit load comparable to at least five credits, course-work directed toward graduation, and the probability of maintaining each.
<u>SERVICE:</u>	Record of services to school and/or community, representing at least two broad areas. (All music or all athletics are considered one area and a community service would be considered another).
<u>LEADERSHIP:</u>	Demonstrated leadership in the aforementioned service areas and/or the classroom.
<u>CHARACTER:</u>	Positive behavior implying adherences to the school conduct code as well as the law (includes ethical behavior, cooperative relations with other students and the staff, and integrity - no cheating, unexcused absences, or code violation).

Each of these areas is judged independently. The selection committee will determine whether you meet **all four criteria** by using a GPA check, a faculty and administration survey, and information provided by the Candidate Data Form (attaching **appropriate** references is recommended).

Each individual is voted upon separately. A simple majority of the faculty selection committee is needed for approval. All individuals will be notified of the decision regarding their status. Those persons selected by the Faculty Committee will be invited to join the National Honor Society. Actual membership will take place through an **initiation ceremony this fall – on Monday, October 14th, 2019.**

After students have become members of the National Honor Society, they are reviewed periodically by the faculty and must maintain the high standards that were required for selection. Members with a deficiency will be warned in writing and given a reasonable amount of time to correct the situation. Serious and/or repetitive violations of the school conduct code will result in dismissal without warning. Dismissed members will have the right to a faculty hearing through an appeals process.

Although you are to be commended for maintaining a high scholastic average, please understand that **membership is not guaranteed.** The Faculty Committee makes the final decision for membership. If you have any questions regarding the society or membership, please contact one of the NHS advisors: Dr. Walter Gnewikow, Principal or Ms. Marty Eichenberg, School Counselor.

Enclosed you will find a copy of the Candidate Data Form. Please have your son or daughter return completed Candidate Data Forms to the Student Services Office by 3:30 pm, Monday, September 23rd. Students will not be considered if they do not return the Candidate Data Form by the Deadline time/date.
