

Logan High School Hybrid Learning Frequently Asked Questions

Schedule and Calendar

Q: How will I know which days my student attends in person and which days are virtual?

- Generally, Cohort A includes students with last names A-L, and Cohort B includes students with last names M-Z. See the hybrid bell schedule for more information.

Q: What changes do I need to be aware of regarding the second semester schedule?

- The start has been changed to 7:40 a.m.
- The 8-period schedule has been moved to Wednesday, and Monday is now an odd EL day (see hybrid bell schedule).
- Wednesday will be a virtual, synchronous, 8-period day for the first three weeks of the semester (see calendar). Synchronous means students are required to be in classes at certain times.
- When in hybrid, Wednesdays become virtual, asynchronous work days unless otherwise indicated on the calendar. Asynchronous means that students do NOT need to be in classes at certain times. Teachers will assign work for students to do that day.
- Attendance will be taken for ALL students on ALL synchronous days.

Q: Will students have access to teachers after 2:20?

- Teachers will have Student-Teacher Assistance Time (STAT) between 2:25-3:25. In-person students may seek help in person (space providing), and virtual students may connect via Zoom for assistance.

Q: Do students have to attend non-class periods?

- A parent-approved release will be issued for in-person Commons, Study Hall, or Homeroom. A Google form will be emailed to parents. A student who has been granted release is expected to leave the building during that period. Students who are attending virtually are not required to check in for non-class periods.

Covid Safety Protocols

Q: What practices have been put in place to protect students and staff?

- Desks have been distanced and will be sanitized between classes.
- Signage has been posted to ensure social distancing and other Covid safety protocols.
- Hand-sanitizing stations have been strategically placed around the school.
- Water fountains have been disabled except for bottle filling stations.
- Desks have replaced tables in the cafeteria to allow for proper spacing.
- Homeroom and lunch have been combined, allowing for more balanced lunch periods.
- Plexiglass has been installed in office areas where student traffic occurs, the LMC, and science lab spaces.
- Health room practices have been adjusted to minimize risk of exposure.
- Students will be provided with two reusable masks; laundering at school will be an option.
- Students, staff, and visitors will be required to fill out the Qualtrics screener in order to come into the building.
- District personnel will contact trace if/when close contacts occur.
- Air filtration systems have been tested, and the number of exchange cycles have been increased.
- Wednesdays have been designated a deep-cleaning day for our building.
- Common gathering areas have been restricted (i.e. LMC, Ranger Resource, weight room, etc).

Q: Are masks required?

- Yes. Masks are required and must be worn over both mouth and nose. Gaiters are acceptable. Masks with vents are not effective and should not be worn.

Q: Are water bottles allowed?

- Yes. Water bottles can be filled at the bottle fillers.

Q: Will lockers be assigned?

- Yes. Students will be assigned lockers; they may choose to use them or not. Social distancing must be maintained while at lockers.

Q: Are backpacks allowed?

- Yes. All types of backpacks will be allowed in the hallways and classrooms temporarily.

Q: How will bathroom passes work?

- Bathrooms will be labeled with maximum capacity signs. Students can get a pass from a teacher to use the restroom during class, or they can use it during their free periods and passing time.

Attendance

Q: What do I do if my student will be absent?

Transportation

Q: Will there be busing?

- Yes. The bus schedule will remain the same. Students who arrive early or need to wait for the bus at the end of the day will be able to do so in designated areas.

Food Service

Q: Will breakfast and lunch be served?

- Both breakfast and lunch are free for all students through the end of the school year. No paperwork is required. There will be no a la carte items offered. Grab-and-go options will be available for students with Homeroom release. Additionally, students will be able to sign up for meals to go for their virtual learning days. These will be handed out at the end of the second in-person day.

Q: Will students be allowed snacks during the day?

- A la carte is not offered. Students who bring a snack can eat it at a desk in the cafeteria during a free period or passing time. No food is allowed in hallways or classrooms.

Activities/Athletics

Q: When can student athletes arrive on their assigned virtual days?

- Student-athletes will be allowed in the building for practices no sooner than 10 minutes before practice starts.
