

In our ever-shifting global landscape, it is essential for students to graduate equipped with the cultural and linguistic capacity to participate in a multilingual and global 21st century society. The Wisconsin Language Roadmap, a program designed to gauge the needs of employers in our state, indicated that the current supply of professionals who are fluent in languages other than English is scarce. There is an ever-increasing need in a variety of professional contexts for multilingual employees. Wisconsin employers highlighted the value of not only language proficiency but also the strong intercultural and global competencies of their multilingual employees.

The Wisconsin Seal of Biliteracy

The Wisconsin Seal of Biliteracy (SBL) is a program that honors the linguistic assets of multilingual students. It is awarded to graduating high school students who have demonstrated advanced achievement in bilingualism, biliteracy, and sociocultural competence in two or more languages. The School District of La Crosse is excited to offer this opportunity to our students in English and either Spanish, French, Chinese, German, Ukrainian, Farsi, or Hmong. The seal may be earned in other languages as well with state approval.

The Certificate of Global Competence

The Certificate of Global Competence, previously known as Global Scholars, is a recognition awarded to students dedicated to global education and issues that desire to become a global citizen. They do this by developing their global competencies through taking courses with a global focus, participating in sociocultural activities in school or the community, and by reflecting on international literature and film. They also must complete a service project that focuses on one of the United Nations seventeen sustainable development goals.
