Orchestra School Supply List

Please make sure that you have the following supplies and remember to bring needed materials when necessary:

- ☐ Instrument, bow, case, & rosin: store rental, own, or school district rental instrument (We have only a very limited school district instrument supply available to families who qualify).
- ☐ Instrument support: shoulder rest/sponge (violin/viola), or endpin rest/rock stop (cello/bass).
- ☐ **Textbook**: Essential Elements for Strings (7/8th grade) or Measures of Success, book 1 (6th grade) (Subsequent and/or supplemental books will be required as students progress and advance.)
- ☐ Concert attire: white collared shirt/blouse with modest neckline, black pants, black shoes & socks.
- **☐ Other:** one box of tissue to share for our classroom, & pencils for personal use in rehearsals.

Orchestra Performances & Performance Reflections

Performances and performance reflections make up 30% of your grade. Up to 100 points for each performance are awarded based on the following: music performed, respectful behavior/performance etiquette, following directions and for bringing all needed materials. In the event a student cannot attend a performance, please see an orchestra teacher as soon as possible to arrange an alternative assignment/make up work to avoid a significant drop in your orchestra grade. Any/all make-up work must be submitted before the end of each quarter. Here are our performances for this year (mark your family calendars!):

Up to 50 points are awarded for each written performance reflection (completed in class after each concert). Reflection points are awarded for responses using complete sentences, grammar, and punctuation to the best of the student's ability. Any/all make-up work must be submitted before the end of each quarter.

Orchestra Rehearsals

Rehearsal points make up 30% of your grade in orchestra. Up to 10 points are awarded for each rehearsal based on: respectful behavior, effort/participation, and for bringing all of your needed materials (instrument, rosin, music, pencil). We meet for orchestra rehearsal three days out of the six day cycle during the school day:

- ☐ 6th Grade Orchestra Rehearsal: 4th Hour (9:45-10:30 am) on odd cycle days 1, 3, 5
- ☐ 7th Grade Orchestra Rehearsal: 2nd Hour (8:15-9:00 am) on odd cycle days 1, 3, 5
- 8th Grade Orchestra Rehearsal: 3rd Hour (9:00-9:45 am) on even cycle days 2, 4, 6 (*tentatively)

Small Group Orchestra Lessons & Regular Home Practice

Small group lessons make up 40% of your grade in orchestra. Up to 50 points are awarded at each lesson for the following: being on time, bringing materials, effort, and skill improvement.

Lessons are scheduled during the school day, for 20 minutes once per cycle (about 5-7 lessons per quarter). Every effort is made to schedule student lessons at a convenient time (the lesson schedule will be posted in the orchestra room and we will begin meeting for lessons during the 3rd cycle of quarter one). If a student misses their lesson, it is their responsibility to contact an orchestra teacher as soon as possible to schedule a makeup. Do not wait until the last week to catch up on lessons, as make up times tend to fill up quickly at the end of each quarter! Any/all make-up work must be completed/submitted before the end of each quarter.

Your lesson teacher will give a new assignment for you to prepare (practice) and write it down on your lesson sheet. Assignments may include exercises from the EE or MOS books, sections of our orchestra music, or other studies. Bring your instrument home for practice at least every other day, as a portion of each lesson grade is based on your skill improvement (practicing leads to improvement)! 20 minutes of home practice every other day is the minimum amount required, although slightly more practice may be needed for students to prepare their assignment well.
