A Message From Ms. Pope

Hello Northside and Coulee Montessori Families!

As our students prepare to leave their classroom families and some take the leap to middle school, my advice to them is to have **courage**.

Courage is the ability to do something difficult even when there is a risk. It also includes making good choices when faced with fear or obstacles. Courage can also be described as bravery. Bravery doesn't mean being fearless, but it means we do not let fear hold us back from experiencing new opportunities, developing our skills, or doing what is right.

For some, courage might look like starting a new school, trying a new activity that stretches us, or learning new skills that take effort. Courage also looks like mastering a new skill even when frustrated, standing up for another person and admitting to one's mistakes. Having courage helps children to persevere against challenges, and in the process, it raises their self-esteem.

Ways that families can support children at home (PBS.org):

- Ensuring children know and understand what courage is and how it might show up in themselves or others.
- Use everyday situations for your children to demonstrate courage. Encourage them to:
 - stand up to peer pressure,
 - refuse to go along with the crowd when the crowd is doing something wrong or dangerous,
 - participate in a new class,
 - master new skills and persist in the face of frustration.
- Acknowledge and praise children when they demonstrate courage.
- Use mistakes as learning opportunities rather than simply punishing them for their actions. Encourage them to face and admit their mistakes openly and honestly and help them find ways to make amends and identify actions for the next time they encounter a similar situation.
- Be a supporter and a role model for your children on what courage looks like, sounds like and feels like.
- Teach your children that sometimes asking for help takes courage.
- Prepare them for new or unfamiliar activities and events. This helps provide the knowledge they need in order to show courage and will help them work through any fears they may have.

Thank you for your continued support and **courage** as we navigate all that we have faced this school year. We wish you all a very safe and enjoyable summer!


Coulee Montessori E2 Trip







FUN FACTS

- Florida and California produce the most radishes! Radishes are available locally in the fall and spring.
- Radishes are harvested after 3-6 weeks of being planted!
- Radishes come in a rainbow of colors including red, black, white and purple.

NUTRITION INFO

One cup sliced radishes has only 19 calories and contains vitamin C, potassium and folate.



Roasted Radishes

Serves 4

Ingredients:

- 1 bunch of small to medium radishes (about 12-15)
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 tsp. dried thyme
- Salt and pepper
- ½ lemon juiced (optional)

Directions:

Preheat oven to 450°F. Place radishes on a baking sheet and toss with olive oil, thyme, salt and pepper. Roast until tender yet firm in the center (about 20 minutes). Squeeze a little lemon juice over the top if desired and serve.

PICK

Look for firm, compact radishes. If the leaves are still attached, they should be bright green and crisp.

STORE

Discard the leaves, place radishes in a plastic bag and store in the refrigerator for up to a week. Radishes can also be pickled for preservation. Radishes have a high water content and therefore do not freeze well.

PREPARE

Remove leaves, wash and trim root ends before using. For added crispness, soak radishes in ice water for a couple of hours before using.

USE

Radishes are great when eaten raw; try with hummus for a quick snack. Enjoy sliced or shredded radishes in salads, sandwiches and side dishes. They can also be steamed, sautéed, and roasted.

One of the goals of Camp Send-A-Kid is to remove the financial barriers from camp. We strive to give those who may not otherwise have the opportunity a chance to experience summer camp.

Those children selected to participate will enjoy their camping experience at Camp Decorah – a large camp owned by the Gateway Area Council.

Nestled among a pine forest along the banks of the Black River near Holmen, Wisconsin, Camp Decorah features hiking trails, swimming pool, wildlife, and rustic mini-cabins. Activities for the campers include educational sessions with the GREAT officers, arts and crafts, canoeing, field games, swimming, archery, nature activities, sports and a visit to a special place for a unique program experience!

A co-ed counselor staff develops a mentoring relationship with the campers, building teamwork skills and camaraderie. Campers are in groups of same gender campers with eight to ten per group. Separate sleeping arrangements in units by age group are planned.

Our dining facility and program center, features delicious and nutritious meals and can accommodate medically necessary dietary needs.

A health supervisor is on duty 24 hours a day to handle minor health and first aid needs. A local physician is on call at all times. A health history form, signed by a licensed health care practitioner, within the past 12 months of the date of camp is required of each youth camper.

2022-2023 4K Preschool Registration is OPEN!

Do you or does someone you know have a child who will turn four years old on or before September 1? If so, please help us spread the word. Now is the time to register for 4K preschool in the School District of La Crosse.

Any child who will be four years old on or before September 1 and lives in the School District of La Crosse attendance area is eligible for 4K preschool. The program is free for any eligible child.

Half-day (2.5 hours) and full day 4K Preschool sessions are available depending on the location. 4K Preschool is housed at a number of centers and schools throughout the district.

There's no deadline for registering, but space is limited, so please sign up early for your preferred placement.

New student registration can be completed entirely online. Visit [Lacrosseschools.org](https://lacrosseschools.org) and click on the "Enroll In Our Schools" button. Follow the prompts to create an account and complete the New Student Online Enrollment process in Skyward.

Families are welcome to come into Hogan Administrative Center (807 East Avenue South La Crosse, Wisconsin) to complete the enrollment process on a computer if needed.

ENROLLMENT DETAILS

Any child who is 4 years old on or before September 1 of the upcoming school year and lives in the La Crosse School District attendance area is eligible for 4K.

The 4K Program is a 2.5-hour program housed at several centers and schools throughout the district. Our 4K Program is free to any eligible child.

To register for 4K, go to www.lacrosseschools.org and select "Enroll in Our Schools." Once you have completed the online enrollment, you will be contacted by the 4K Office to confirm enrollment and placement. In person enrollment is available at Hogan Administrative Center 807 East Avenue South.
