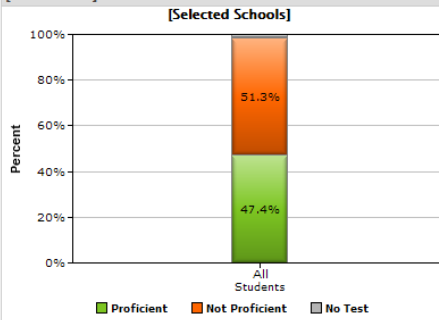

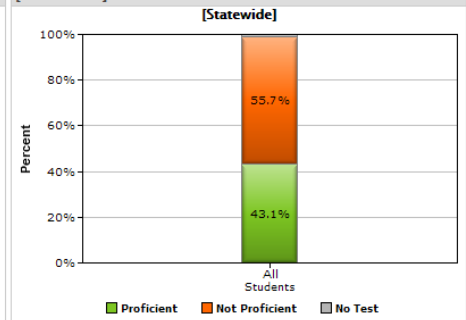

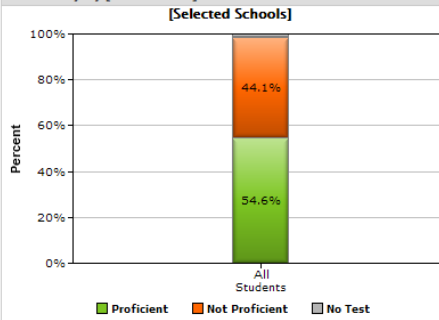
2017-18 Forward and DLM ELA Proficiency by [All Students]



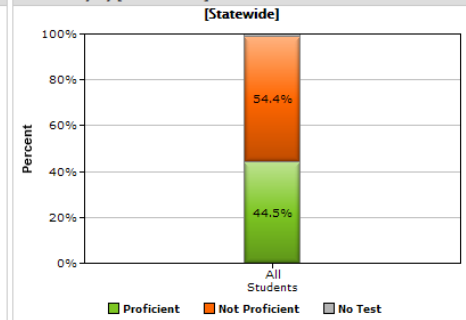
2017-18 Forward and DLM ELA Proficiency by [All Students]
