How does it work?

Once everyone understands the commitment involved, both parents and students sign the application form and turn it in to the Global Coordinator, Mr. Havlicek (Rm.224) or your world language teacher.

The second step is to plan when you will complete each of the components. Use the checklist to know what components are required and check off what you have completed.

Throughout the school year, get involved in clubs, trips, and school activities. Once you have completed an activity, have the advisor or an adult sign off on the activity participation sheet and turn it in to your world language teacher or Mr. Havlicek.

The last component that takes thought, time, planning and motivation is the global/cross-cultural public service project. You will be solely responsible for completing the entire project yourself or with another global scholar. Fill out the service approval form and turn this in. Plan ahead!!
